BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

Incorporated in May 2023, the West Virginia First Foundation (WVFF) is responsible for distributing 72.5% of the state's opioid settlement funds from the Qualified Settlement Fund (QSF). The remaining funds are allocated from the QSF as follows: 24.5% to Local Governments and 3% to the Office of the West Virginia Attorney General. The funds allocated from the QSF to the Local Governments and Attorney General do not pass through WVFF; they flow directly from the QSF to the Local Governments and Attorney General. WVFF **does not oversee** how Local Governments use their 24.5% share; however, WVFF is responsible for collecting data and reporting those expenditures in accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding.

\$73.5 million was distributed directly to Local Governments from the QSF in December 2023 (reported here). An additional \$24.5 million was disbursed in January 2025, which will be reported no later than April 30, 2026.

Prepared in accordance with Section C(13) of WVFF's Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), this first-of-its-kind Annual QSF Expenditure Report reflects how Local Governments within Regions used their direct share of Opioid Settlement Funds from the QSF during the previous fiscal year. This report is intended to serve as a living resource, evolving alongside community needs and data quality.

C(13) Each Local Government shall submit an annual financial report to the Foundation no later than April 30 of each year specifying the amounts spent on Approved Purposes within the Region during the previous fiscal year. A report for each Region shall be prepared no later than thirty days thereafter. Each Region's report shall incorporate the information disclosed in each Local Government's annual report generated pursuant to Section B(4), above. Each Region's report shall specify (i) the amount of Opioid Funds received, (ii) the amount of Opioid Funds disbursed or applied during the previous fiscal year, broken down by categories of Approved Uses (indicating the name of the recipient, the amount awarded, a description of the use of the award, and disbursement terms), and (iii) impact information measuring or describing the progress of the Approved Use strategies.

This report **does not** include funding distributed by WVFF, a private, nonprofit organization. Instead, it summarizes data submitted by Local Governments as required by the MOU, detailing their spending on Approved Purposes. Each Local Government was responsible for submitting its annual financial report to the Foundation by April 30, 2025. This regional summary incorporates all such submissions and was compiled within the thirty-day window outlined in the MOU. The report includes:

- The total amount of Opioid Funds received directly by Local Governments in the Region
- A breakdown of how those funds were spent, categorized by Approved Uses
- Award recipient details, including amounts, descriptions of use, and disbursement terms
- Impact information highlighting measurable outcomes and community benefit

WVFF COMMUNICATION AND OUTREACH EFFORTS

In an effort to support compliance with Section C(13) of the MOU, WVFF implemented a multi-pronged outreach strategy to ensure that all Local Governments were aware of their annual reporting obligations.


To facilitate this process, WVFF built and launched WV SUMMIT (Settlement Utilization and Monitoring for Measurable Impact and Transparency), the reporting tool used to collect, track, and manage expenditure data from Local Governments across the state. WVFF then issued:

- Two (2) physical letters that were mailed to each county and municipality. The first, sent on 4/3/25, outlined the April 30 reporting deadline, information on a virtual webinar session, and reporting expectations as outlined in the MOU. The second, sent on 5/23/25, reiterated the same messaging to those that had not yet submitted their reports.
- A comprehensive user manual, detailing step-by-step instructions on how to access, navigate, and complete required reporting within WV SUMMIT. The manual included annotated screenshots, troubleshooting tips, FAQs, and guidance on each reporting field.
- A virtual webinar session with multiple date/time options, including a recorded offering, was held to walk Local Governments through how to access and use WV SUMMIT, clarify expectations, and answer questions in real time. These sessions occurred on 4/4/25 and 4/9/25.
- A follow-up email, sent on 6/16/25, that reiterated the requirements and provided submission instructions and contact information for support.
- **Personal follow-up phone calls** made by Board Members, Executive Director Jonathan Board, and Chief Financial Officer- Anthony Woods, to Local Governments that had not submitted by the deadline, offering assistance and encouraging compliance. These calls were made during the week of 7/7/25.

Copies of the letters, email, WV SUMMIT user manual, and WV SUMMIT portal examples are included in the appendix of this report.

Looking ahead, WVFF, in partnership with the West Virginia Attorney General's Office, is developing educational content aimed at helping Local Governments better understand how to utilize their Opioid Settlement Funds and meet reporting requirements. This initiative will include training opportunities, technical assistance, and clear guidance on documenting expenditures and measuring impact in alignment with the Approved Purposes defined in the MOU.



You are receiving this letter because, as of today, the West Virginia First Foundation has not received your annual report detailing Qualified Settlement Fund (QSF) expenditures for the reporting period of July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024.

This is the second communication regarding this requirement. An initial letter, including detailed instructions and login information, was sent to all counties and municipalities on April 5, 2025.

Per the Memorandum of Understanding governing the opioid settlement, every county commission and municipality receiving opioid settlement funds must submit Qualified Settlement Fund expenditure reports to the West Virginia First Foundation via our online portal. The deadline to submit this report to the Foundation was April 30, 2025. Even if your municipality or county did not expend any opioid settlement funds from July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024, you must still submit a 'no-expenditure' report to the Foundation.

Be advised that reporting uses of opioid settlement funds to the Foundation is required by the Memorandum of Understanding approved by the courts. Failure to report could result in disqualification from future funding opportunities.

Instructions for Submitting Annual Qualified Settlement Fund Expenditure Reports in WV-SUMMIT

April 1, 2025

Introduction

Welcome to the instructions for submitting annual Qualified Settlement Fund expenditure reports in the WV-SUMMIT (Settlement Utilization and Monitoring for Measurable Impact and Transparency) portal.

Per the West Virginia First Foundation Memorandum of Understanding, each county or municipality receiving Qualified Settlement Funds ("QSF") is required to annually report to the Foundation on how those funds were spent. The Foundation is required to compile this information and include it in our annual report.

This manual can assist counties and municipalities in completing this annual report. We estimate that this report will take about 60-90 minutes to complete. We recommend gathering important documentation beforehand related to opioid expenditures such as invoices, contracts, receipts, etc., bank statements, and general ledger reports or information. Additionally, we recommend you consult with stakeholders in your county or municipal government who could provide insight regarding outcomes met and achievements obtained through expenditures.

What Must Be Reported?

We will be collecting the following information from each county or municipality:

- Contact information (and backup contact information) for each county and municipality
- Information about your internal controls and methodology for disbursing
 Qualified Settlement Funds
- Amounts that you received, amounts that you expended, and the amounts remaining
- Line-item detail about each expenditure made from Qualified Settlement Funds, including: the recipient, the contract terms, the amount paid, the Memorandum of Understanding Approved Use Category, the purpose of each expenditure, and the outcomes experienced by making each expenditure
- If you made expenditures that served more than one county: which counties and the breakdown in totals of expenditures
- Some optional survey questions regarding opioid use disorder (OUD) in your county or municipality
- Certification information and information on who is submitting the report

Accessing the Portal and Report

Step One: Access the Portal Site

In a web browser, navigate to https://wvfirstreporting.com. Edge or Chrome on a desktop are preferred instead of a mobile device.

Step Two: Click "Sign In"

Once the page loads, click the Sign In button.

Step Three: Enter username and password from provided credentials and then click "Sign In"

Each local government received a letter with their username and password to access the WV-SUMMIT portal. If you did not receive your credentials, e-mail finance@wvfirst.org. Be sure to identify which county or municipality you represent. Enter your username and password into the login box, then click the **Sign In** button.

Step Four: Click the "Create New QSF Report" button



We obtained e-mail addresses from the Qualified Settlement Fund administrators. Some e-mail addresses may be invalid or correspond to individuals no longer with your county or municipality. You can still submit a report with these credentials – they are connected to your county or municipality. We recommend you contact finance@wvfirst.org to add users or make updates if necessary.

The Annual QSF Report

The QSF Annual Reporting Form is divided into seven parts. Depending on your county or municipality, some parts may be skipped while others should be completed by all governments. Depending on the quantity of information you need to report, we estimate completion of the report will take 30-90 minutes.



Currently, the QSF reporting form does not have the functionality to save midway and return later. You may wish to review the prompts and compile the information in advance so that you may enter data and complete the form in one session. We apologize for this inconvenience and intend to implement this functionality soon.

You will need to report amounts received and expenditures made from **July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024.** Governments should report receipts and expenditures on the cash basis – in other words, only funds actually and constructively received and expenditures in which cash has been paid. Do not include amounts obligated, encumbered, or contracted unless funds have been actually paid or received.

For this first annual report, we are collecting information from local governments to build a contact list. Even if the information we have on file for your government is correct, please take a moment to confirm and update this information to ensure we have the best contact information possible if we need to contact you. Effective internal controls:

- Set a 'tone at the top' of ethical behavior
- Set goals for the protection of financial assets and the quality of financial reporting and identify risks that may prevent the accomplishment of those goals
- Outline business processes and control activities that allow governments to respond to those risks
- Provide a mechanism to inform employees, elected officials, and other stakeholders of the process
- Continually evaluate the effectiveness of the process and adjust as necessary



If you have not implemented effective internal controls, make plans to do so as soon as possible. The Foundation will soon be publishing additional information on how local governments can implement controls for qualified settlement funds.

Separate Bank Account

Check this box to confirm that your county or municipality is maintaining the QSF funds in a separate bank account. The State Auditor's Office requires these funds to be placed in a

separate account. This allows for easier reporting and recordkeeping and allows funds to remain segregated.



If you have not deposited QSF funds into a separate bank account, make plans to do so as soon as possible. Avoid commingling opioid settlement funds with other funds.

Current Disbursement Process

Provide the amount of QSF funds you had on hand and unexpended as of June 30, 2024, even if otherwise encumbered or obligated.

Part D. Multi-County and Multi-Region Expenditure Breakdown

Some local governments, particularly municipalities which span more than one county or counties that made expenditures for the benefit of one or more counties, might need to report expenditures for more than one county. You will report this in Part D.

If you only made expenditures for the benefit of one county, you may skip Part D and proceed to Part E.

For the purposes of reporting, expenditures are considered benefitting a county if the expenditures were an Approved Use as defined in the Memorandum of Understanding and were primarily expended within a particular county.

EXAMPLE: Half of Example City's city limits are within Demonstration County

and the other half is within Illustration County. Example City received

\$100,000 in QSF funds during the reporting period and grants

\$50,000 to each county health department. Example City will report \$50,000 expended in Demonstration County and \$50,000 expended

in Illustration County.

EXAMPLE: Example County received \$100,000 in QSF funds. Example County

spent \$80,000 to improve Example County's child advocacy center. Since there are no treatment facilities in Example County, but much of Example County's population receives treatment in neighboring

Demonstration County, Example County grants \$20,000 to

Demonstration County's treatment facility. Example County would report \$80,000 expended in Example County and \$20,000 expended

in Demonstration County.

As always, report expenditures on the cash basis and only report actual amounts expended, not obligated, encumbered, or committed.

This part is optional. We have presented five questions for response. We would appreciate your feedback and input as we develop a statewide needs-based assessment.

Part G. Certification and Submission

In this section, you will certify your responses and provide information regarding the person completing the report.

Certification Check Box

Click this check box to certify that all information submitted in the report is accurate and complete to the best of your knowledge and that all expenditures made by your municipality or county were for an Approved Use as detailed in the West Virginia First Foundation Memorandum of Understanding.

Name of Person Submitting Report

Enter the name of the person completing and submitting the report.

Submitting the Report

Click the **Submit** button to submit the report. You will be redirected to a closing screen where you can then click **Sign Out** to sign out of the WV-SUMMIT system.

The system will download a submission receipt. This will be a text file. This contains an encoded version of your report. Be sure to retain a copy of this file. If there was an issue submitting your report to the system this receipt file contains information that may allow us to recover your report. If this is the case, we will contact you via e-mail to send this file to us, potentially saving you from having to redo the entire report.



Be sure to save the submission receipt that's downloaded in a safe place on your computer. If there is an issue with your report submission, that file may help us recover the data you entered.
